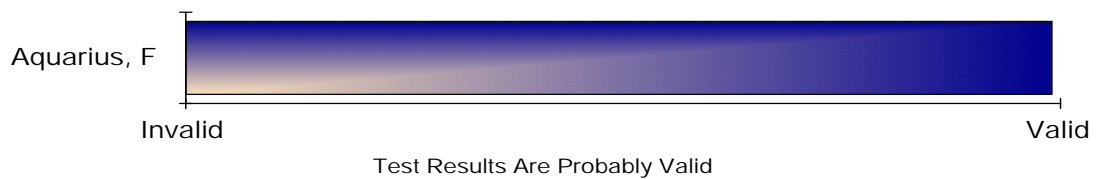

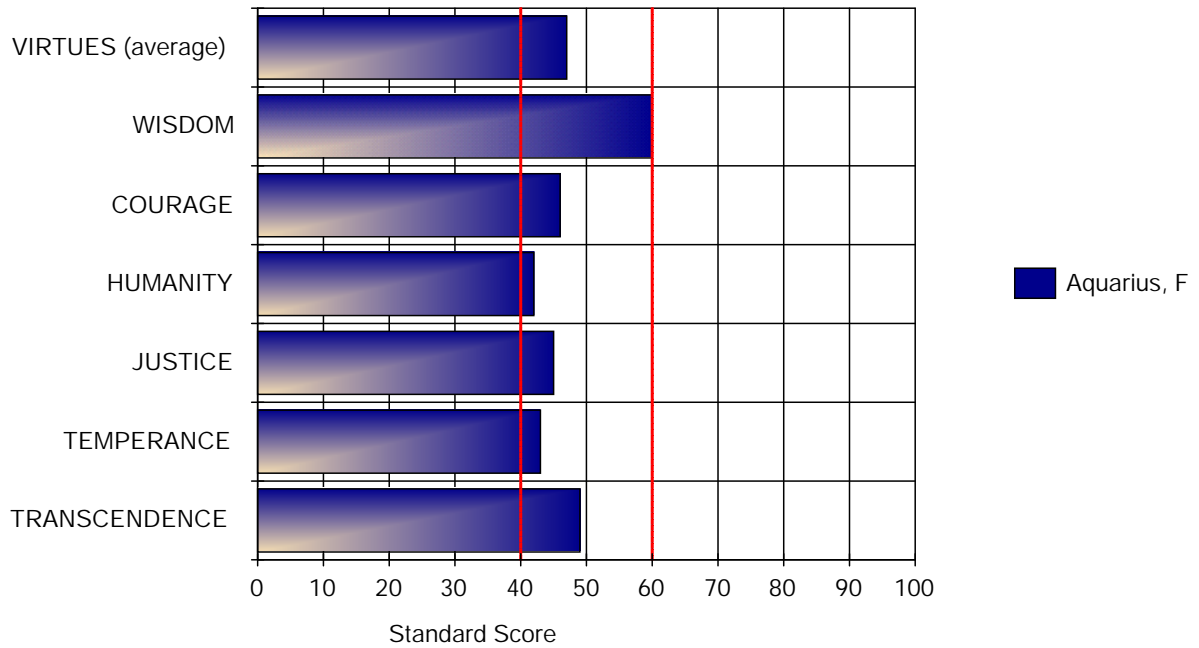

Introduction

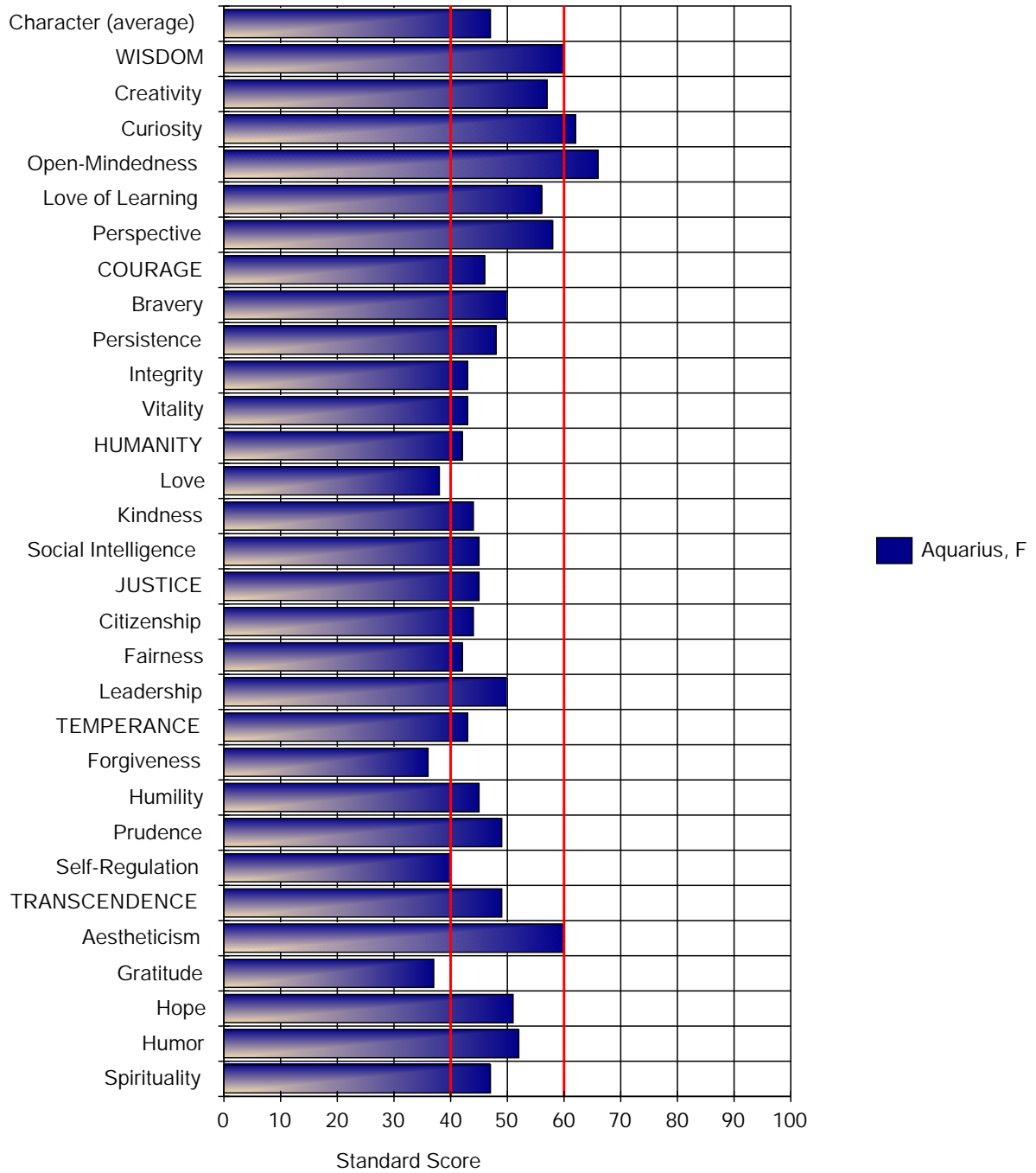

Wisdom and Knowledge

Justice

Temperance
